Description	<p>EUPATI is a multi-stakeholder public-private partnership originally launched by the IMI-EUPATI project (2012-2017) and hosted by the European Patients' Forum (EPF) from 2017 to 2020.</p> <p>EUPATI is today established as an independent non-profit Foundation in the Netherlands. It is a successful programme that provides education and training to increase the capacity and capability of patients and patient representatives to understand and meaningfully contribute to medicines research and development (R&D), and to improve the availability of medical information for patients and other stakeholders.</p> <p>TOOLBOX</p> <p>The EUPATI Toolbox is organised in two main areas: Medicines R&D and Patient Engagement. It hosts a variety of materials related to Medicines R&D. This includes articles, presentations, videos, webinars, starter kits, factsheets, guidance documents, infographics, and glossary items. Aside from the main articles that are found on the Toolbox, the EUPATI guidance documents and Webinars are core products that EUPATI offers.</p>

	<p>if you are interested in a certain Medicines R&D subject area, the toolbox includes a selection of 12 key introductory topics to help you choose from: Basics of Medicine R&D, Clinical Development / Trials, Drug Discovery, Personalised Medicine, Regulatory Affairs, Benefit and Risk Assessment, HTA, Pharmaceutical Development, Safety of Medicines, Non-Clinical Studies, Pharmacoepidemiology, Types of Medicines.</p> <p>At the moment, the Toolbox contains information in 13 languages (nonetheless, the Toolbox is continuously expanding and will soon be available in more languages).</p>

Scope of use	<p>Patient Training and use the EUPATI toolbox for advocacy</p> <p>Research but also experience in patient advocacy and activism show that experts and patients, and their organisations are an important part of medicines development.
